

All Spies To Come Here.

On Monday morning word was received from the militia department at Ottawa to the effect that the department had decided to ship all the German and Austrian spies, who are arrested in the province of Ontario to Fort Henry, where they will be kept in safe keeping until the war is over.

It is the intention of the department to fix up the rooms so that they will be fit for men to live in. Although it is eighty years since the last war prisoners were confined to the fort, the rooms are in fairly good condition. The water supply is taken out of a large well, which is first-class.

The four Germans who are at present confined to the fort appear to be enjoying themselves. Each man is furnished with a wire spring and mattress to sleep on.

It is the intention of the department to place officers in separate rooms.

At the present time there are three guards on duty for a period of twenty-four hours. Each guard has forty-eight hours off duty. The sergeants in charge of the fort guards are Col.-Sergts. S. Fraser, H. B. Trotter and acting Sergt. Walker.

Each of the Germans is allowed out of his cells for a period of one hour each day, in charge of an armed guard all the while.
