
AUSTRIAN PRISONERS

TAKEN TO FORT HENRY

**MILITARY GUARD HAD STRICT
ORDERS AND WERE ALL
HEAVILY ARMED.**

Sarnia, Aug. 25.—Prisoners of war, **Austrians** to the number of fourteen, were taken from the police station this morning by Sergt.-Major Spittall of London and a detachment of seven soldiers. The foreigners have from time to time been taken from Grand Trunk trains from the west and locked up at the police station. They were turned over to the military authorities, and Sergt. Spittall and his men arrived last night to take them to Fort William Henry, Kingston, where they will be held until the conclusion of the war. The soldiers were all heavily armed, and had orders to shoot to kill if their **prisoners** attempted to escape. These orders were necessary, as **prisoners** of war cannot be handcuffed. Every man in the Sergeant's detachment is a veteran of the Transvaal war; as he is also himself.
