LEAVES ONTARIO CITY AND CANNOT RETURN

MRS. TAHL IN ENGLAND VICTIM OF IMMIGRATION RE- STRICTIONS.

London, Aug. 26.—A remarkable instance of complications over the enforced restrictions upon aliens is furnished by Oscar Tahl of Berlin, Ont., and his widowed mother. They left New York on July 25th on the Kronprinzessin Cecilie, his mother, Mrs. Tahl, intending to visit his father in Germany. The steamer was captured and taken into Falmouth, the passengers being released fairly promptly, however. Tahl finds that the steamship companies refuse to grant his mother, having lived in Canada 25 years, passage back to the Dominion. Tahl himself is a naturalized British subject. Hon. G. H. Perley is endeavoring to arrange the matter.
Another instance of how closely the movements of strangers are looked after is furnished by Dr. Wallace of Guelph, Ont., who was required to produce passports before being granted a ticket for Ireland.

KELL'S DEATH UNSOLVED. Coroner's Jury Returns Open Verdict on Young Sentry.

St. Catharines, Aug. 26.—The Coroner's jury returned an open verdict on the death of Private Fred. Kells, 19th Regiment, the military guard whose body was taken from Welland Canal last week. The jury was unable to determine whether deceased came to his death through accidental means or other causes.

HAD BETTER REPORT. Officer's Advice to Austrian Reservists in Kent.

Chatham, Aug. 26.—An Austrian reservist is under arrest in Tilbury orders for his apprehension having been issued by Col. Smith of the 24th Regiment when it was learned the man was planning to return to his regiment. Colonel Smith advises all German and Austrian reservists in Kent county to report to him periodically.
