## ELEVEN AUSTRIANS UNDER GUARD One Hundred and Fifty Were Examined Yesterday by the

There are now 11 Austrians under military guard in a tent at the canal grounds, and one is held by the policy. This is the result of the work of the sist regiment and the local policy yes-

terday. In the morning 96 Austrians arrived in town, and from 32 that

were escorted to the barracks, 9 were put under guard. In the afternoon 50 more arrived over the A.C.R. and 50 these 15 were examined at the barracks of whom two were detained. their transportation for Austria all arranged for some time ago, their tickets being found in their possession. The work of rounding up the foreign reservists entalts a good deal of work which is being efficiently done by the local regiment.
