The "Vancouver German Press" was issued as usual-vesterday-in spite of the agitation to have it suppressed. It contained an editorial in English and one in German referring to the possibility of its being closed during the war. The editorials are addressed to the readers and point that there has been no appreciable loss of advertising patronage because of the racial feeling caused by the war. The editorial intimates that the paper is more interested in Canadian affairs than in the progress of the war from a partizan standpoint, and the readers are assured that if the publication

is voluntarily discontinued it will be done only during the progress of the war.
