HAVE FIREARMS Delivery to Police Must Be Made

ALIENS MAY NOT

Before September 23, Under a Heavy Penalty. Ottawa, Sept. 6 .- An order-in-councli has been passed under the pro-

visions of the War Measures act passed at the recent session of parliament relating to the prevention of the use of firearms, dynamite, gunpower or other dangerous explosives by foreigners

in Canada. The order declares that it will be the duty of all allen enemies naving in their possession firearms, ammunition, dynamite, gunpowder, etc. to deliver the same to a justice of the peace or to an officer or constable of the R.N.W.M.P., within ten days after Sept. 3. The justice of peace or constable re-

celving firearms, ammunition, etc., shall give a receipt for the same and shall report the fact to the chief commissioner of the Dominion police or to the commissioner of the Northwest Mounted Police under whose direction the property shall be retained or otherwise disposed of Searches Allowed.

may be searched by any police officer or constable without warrant, and the property seized. If such seizure takes place after the elapse of ten days the property seized may be forfeited to the crown and the owners be hable to a penalty not exceeding \$500

and to impragnment for a term not exceeding three months. It soull be an offense for any person to give. sell, or hire firearms, etc., to an alien. Any person guilty of such action shall

be liab - to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dellars or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one month.

Prosecutions may be proceeded with by way of summary conviction under

the provisions of the criminal code. The onus of establishing whether or

not a person proceeded against is an alten enemy shall lie upon the accused
