selves to the American relief committee as American citizens. Scalland Yard detectives are looking into their passports and other credentials, which are believed to have been forged or stolen.

There is an excessive number of German speaking refugees amons those claiming American citisenship. This fact has caused much comment for the last two days, and the American relief committee believes the English officials are justified in having A

assisting that they are sples and availed themselves of the opportunity to enter England.

Walter Hines Page, the American ambassador, has instructed the pisarport, officials to exercise the greatest

care in issuing passports to alleged Americans, and American embassies and consulates on the continent have been advised of alleged frauds and cautioned to beware of imposters tacing advantage of the rush caused by

the war to secure American credentials.

Many refugees pretending to be
American citizens have been found
merely to have Hved in the United
States, or to have made application

there for first citizenship vapers without completing their citizenship, while others have statements from American consuls which they believed to be passports. The liberal immigration laws and the war rush have emabled

laws and the war rush have enabled such persons to enter England, but the steamship lines will be unable to carry indigent persons of this class to the United States and the relief committee has authority to extend relief only to

actual American oitizens.
