## THE CENSORSHIP To be effective in accomplishing the purposes for which it is intended, the censorship must be applied strictly to all newspap-

ers alike. On repeated occasions when The Daily News has been in doubt as to the advisability of using items, both telegraphic and local, reference has been made to the censor, and in some

cases the censor has "advised" that the item should not be used. Yet apparently no attempt has been made to warn other newspapers, with t'e result that sup-

pression of the items in question by The Daily News has been of little or no effect, while the censor's ruling has placed

this paper under a real handicap as against papers which have not received similar instructions. The Daily News has no desire that restrictions should

be imposed upon its contemporaries, but it does believe that when a newspaper is instructed or "requested" to suppress any

news, there should be some system by which the censor or censors should promptly issue simi-

lar instructions to all other newspapers. Such a warning could easily be given through the Canadian Press Association

or by the local censors.
