

SUES VON ALVENSLEBEN

**Seattle National Bank Gets Judgment
for \$8000 and Interest on Notes.**

Another judgment against Mr. Alvo von Alvensleben and the firm of Alvo von Alvensleben Limited was entered today in the Supreme Court when the Seattle National Bank obtained judgment for \$8000 and interest on a promissory note.

The note was payable to the Lake Washington Mill Co. and had been specially endorsed to the Seattle National Bank. It became due on March 14 of this year. Mr. von Alvensleben, who is a lieutenant in the German army, is at present domiciled in Seattle, where rumor credits him with having in his possession a commission from the Kaiser appointing him Governor of British Columbia, subject to certain contingencies.

Mr. W. Casey appeared on behalf of the Seattle National Bank. The application for speedy judgment had been adjourned twice by Mr. Justice Clement to give the defendants every opportunity to defend, but no opposition was entered to the application for judgment.
