

OVER TWO HUNDRED

ARE BEING HELD IN FORT AS
GERMAN SUSPECTS.

**A Prisoner in the Military Hospital,
a Sufferer From Appendicitis —
Those Confined Are Pleased With
the Treatment.**

The number of prisoners of war in confinement at Fort Henry is increasing. During the past few days ten more were brought to the city and handed over.

On Saturday two volunteers arrived from Morrisburg with a man who had been rounded up at the locks. There were three men in the company but, unfortunately, two made their escape.

At the present time there are over two hundred prisoners in confinement. One is confined to the military hospital, on Queen street, suffering from appendicitis. While in the hospital he is guarded by a member of the 14th regiment.

As evidence that the Germans and Austrians are well pleased with the treatment they are receiving is shown in the fact that it is almost impossible to chase some of them away. One man, let out on parole last week, stayed around the city and Barriefield until it was found necessary to take the ex-prisoner to the train and make sure that he left the city for the place he came from.
