## All Germans and Austrians in England Under Arrest (Srecial Cable to The Editionton Journal and The Monteral Rias—Registered Accounting to Copyright LONDON, Oct. 23.—The military situation is developing so satisfactoricily that Englishmen are thinking more today of the British government's

somewhat sensational new policy of rounding up all non-naturalized Germans and Austrians of the fighting age, namely 17 to 45. Thousands of arrects in all parts of the country included men of every class and profession. England holds altegether 16,141 Austrians and 50,832 Germans, 6500 of them naturalized. Berlin messages reflect the anger provoked bythis impounding of possible spies, though they are being treated more kindly than many Britishers impounded in Germany and Austria. Moreover, anti-German ricting in the poorer quarters of London seem to indicate that the step is desirable in the interests of the aliens themselves. It was strange to see yesterday wealthy Germans arriving at a concentration camp in their own cars under police escort, while one German who was arrested was actually wearing the uniform of the metropolitan water board which controls the water supply of the motropolism.—WINDERMERE
