

Alien Enemies Have No Rights in Court

*Even Action Begun Before
War Cannot be Gone on
With*

An interesting alien enemy case was aired yesterday before Chief Justice Falconbridge at Osgoode Hall. A motion for a stay of proceedings on behalf of his Austrian clients, Feko Dumenco and his wife, who are suing the Canadian Swift Company in connection with the death of their son, was asked for by counsel for the plaintiffs. His Lordship, however, dismissed the motion, contending that although the action had been commenced before the war, plaintiffs have since become alien enemies. This dismissal however does not act as a bar to subsequent action on the restoration of peace.
