Man Who Was Here From Toronto Community With Austrian War Prisoners Brought in Court Yesterday

## PRISONER WELL EDUCATED IMMIGRANT FROM RUSSIA

John J. Rowens, 397 Market street, Toronto, appeared in the police court vesterday morning, and was charged with high treason in seeking to assist the enemy's reservists to leave this country to join the fighting forces against us in Europe. He pleaded not guilty and was remanded without bail. He will be tried in a higher court. The offence is punishable by death,

Rowens is employed in the steamship offices of Mr. Louis Gurofsky. and was arrested on Wednesday afternoon by Plainclothesmen Maurer and Hess, following information given to the Toronto police by the immigration officers at Niagara Falls, Ont.

On Tuesday evening the officials at the Falis stopped a party of Austrians who had tickets to the United States. Not satisfied with the statement that they were Roumanians, the officers furthrough an interpreter. They are al-

leged to have admitted that they had Canada from Russia:

with the alleged intention of evading the immigration officers to go to Austria to take part in the present conflict. The information thus obtained was sent to the Toronto police, who immediately arrested Rowens. Rowens was taken to Stanley barracks. An investigation was held on Thursday.
