These orders include the recent ones passed with regard to the compulsory registration of all Germans and Austrians in Canada; the same provision

will apply to all Turks in the Domin-Reports received from the Royal

Northwest Mounted Police show that there are now nearly 200,000 Austrians and Germans in Alberta and Saskatchewan, while elsewhere in Canada there

are about 100.000. The government plans to keep a considerable number of these employed under supervision in the west this winter and next spring to put them on public works connected with the clearing up of Dominion parks, the building of roads through them, etc. There is also a proposal under consideration to set them at work in the spring breaking up and tilling suitable areas of Dominion lands, not now cul-

tivated in the west
