ALIEN LAW FAIR, SAY CONTROLLERS

Apparently Theodore Hunt, corporation counsel, has been brought to task by many foreign residents regarding his stand taken recently on the registration of the alien municipal vote.

In a letter to the board of control

today he says: "There appears to be a great deal of ignorance as to the law

regarding the municipal franchise. The law specifically states that no person shall vote unless he be a British subject by birth, or is a naturalized British citizen."

The controllers all agreed that Mr. Hunt's critics should better acquaint

themselves with the law.

"The law is eminently fair," said Controller Midwinter. "Why, in the United States, a man can't get title to a piece of land unless he is a citizen of the United States."
