

# DEBARRED FROM VOTING

Unnaturalized Germans, Austrians and  
Turks Are Turned Down

OTTAWA, Nov. 20.—Deputy returning officers in municipal elections throughout Canada will have a new duty to perform, and it will probably be the first instance in the history of Canada when certain men whose names appear on the voters' lists will not be allowed to cast their ballots. There are many residents of German, Austrian and Turkish nationality who are not naturalized Canadians, and as such, under an order in council, have no rights. While their names may appear on the municipal voters' list as occupants or owners of property, it will be the duty of the deputy returning officers to prevent their voting, or make an effort to do so. To do this it may be necessary to swear all voters of foreign nationality whether they be naturalized or not.
