

Police Court News

"When this damned Canada can send men to fight against us in Germany, then Germany should know enough to take Canada. We here would have started thunderation long ago only we had not enough weapons, but if we have a start we can find enough material in this country now to do something." These are the kind of paragraphs found in letters which were taken from the person of Peter Dick, who is now being held by the city police, charged with having a German uniform in his possession and who may, perhaps, ultimately have to face a charge of treason.

Peter Dick is a German who, according to the police, has been attempting to start sedition among the peaceful German residents of the city. In a letter found in his possession, he not only curses Canada and terms Great Britain as Germany's bitterest enemy, but also attacks the United States, saying that the latter country has been partial in its feeling toward the allied forces, and especially Great Britain, in allowing ships of the latter power to ply in United States waters. The case against Dick of having a German uniform, a sword and ammunition in his possession, will be heard in police court Monday morning.
