

## **SAYER IS REMANDED ON SMUGGLING CHARGE**

### **PENDING INVESTIGATION INTO THAT OF HIGH TREASON IN CONVEYING AUSTRIANS.**

(Special Despatch to The Globe.)

Sault Ste. Marie, Ont., Nov. 20.—

Robert Sayer, a half-breed living at Bay City, who was arrested by the local militia last night charged with smuggling Austrian **reservists** across the river to Michigan, at his preliminary hearing this morning before Magistrate Elliott in the City Police Court admitted taking six across, but is suspected of having taken more. He charged \$2.50 per head, and afterwards raised the price to \$3.50. Capt. J. A. McPhail prosecuted on behalf of the Militia Department.

Sayer was remanded for eight days pending investigation at Ottawa to determine whether the charge of high treason can be established.

### **WAR LOAN IS SWELLED.**

#### **Reports of Recent Victories Help to Float Austrian Loan.**

Venice, Nov. 20.—The subscriptions to the Austrian war loan during the first two days aggregated 700,000,000 crowns (about \$170,000,000), the announcement of Austrian victories over the Servians, it is stated, having greatly stimulated public investments. The Imperial family and various organizations were the largest subscribers. Banks and industrial corporations also invested heavily.
