

# **Every Canadian Soldier With German Name Placed Under Arrest in England**

---

**Orders From War Office Cause Sensation in Overseas Camp  
—Men Who Fought With Britain in Boer War and Wore  
Queen Victoria's Medals Are Included**

TORONTO, Nov. 25.—Writing from Salisbury Plain under date of Nov. 7, the Globe's correspondent says:

“There has been a sensation in the Canadian camp. Orders have been received from the war office that every Canadian volunteer with a German name was to be placed under arrest and examined. Practically every unit was affected, and tonight scores of men with German names have been apprehended and taken to headquarters, where they await the next move of the authorities. It is probable that they will be taken to a concentration camp. The unfortunate feature of the whole affair is that there are many among the prisoners who fought with the British in South Africa and in other parts of the world. There are several in the company who had medals pinned on their breasts by the late Queen Victoria, and one of these wept bitterly when he was taken from the ranks.”
