Orders From War Office Cause Sensation in Overseas Camp
—Men Who Fought With Britain in Boer War and Wore
Queen Victoria's Medals Are Included

TORONTO, Nov. 25.—Writing from Salisbury Plain under date of Nov. 7, the Globe's correspondent says:

"There has been a sensation in the Canadian camp. Orders have been received from the war office that every Canadian volunteer with a German name was to be placed

under arrest and examined. Practically every unit was affected, and tonight scores of men with German names have been apprehended and taken to headquarters, where they swait the next move of the authorities.
