tingent was affected and tonight scores of men with German names have been apprehended and taken to headquarters where they now await the next move of the authorities. It is probable that they will be taken

to a concentration camp.

The unfortunate feature of the whole affair is that there are many among the prisoners who fought with the British in South Africa and in other parts of the world. There are received in the company who had made
