

TO REMOVE PRISONERS AWAY FROM BARRACKS

Will Be Sent to Petawawa and
Fort Henry — Turk Is
Taken to Barracks.

A Turk was arrested to-day and taken to **Stanley Barracks** for safe-keeping. The prisoners of war are to be taken away from Stanley Barracks. It was stated to-day that a number would be sent to the Petawawa Camp, and others to Fort Henry, Kingston, within a few days, and the Austrians and Germans are to be kept separate from now on. It is likely that they will be given Government work to do during the winter. There are now 90 prisoners at Stanley Barracks, and no accommodation for any more.

The 19th Battalion received training in outpost work—the art of guarding troops at rest—in High Park to-day, under Major H. C. Bickford. There were 1,100 men in the party, and they extended from Bloor street to the lake front, facing west. The 20th Battalion rested quietly following inoculation yesterday.

Private Edwin Twewin, who was found yesterday to have typhoid fever, was taken to the General Hospital to-day. He was a member of the 20th Battalion, and came in with the Legion of Frontiersmen of Rutland, Sask. He had been in camp two days, had not been inoculated, and the medical board ascertained that the disease was contracted previous to enlistment.
