

SAUERKRAUT NOT WANTED

German Name Makes It Drug
on the Market Just Now.

Manufacturers of sauerkraut in the Dominion will in future be wise to change the name of that palatable German relish to "pickled cabbage," otherwise they will find it a drug on the market. At least this has been the experience of the Campbellford Fruit Company, which now has 600 45-gallon barrels of sauerkraut on its hands, for which it is looking for a market in vain.

The company, finding it impossible to dispose of its supply here, and having the German market cut off, communicated with the department of trade and commerce and asked it if it could not find a market. The department circularized its trade commissioners in Great Britain and elsewhere, advertising for sale 600 barrels of sauerkraut.

Only one reply has so far been received, and it is not encouraging. It is from the trade commissioner at Bristol, and is to the effect: "After making extensive inquiries I find there is no demand for sauerkraut in this district."
