A letter received last night from the same correspondent says: "Pri-vate Cobb of the 18th Highlanders is in the guardhouse. He was alleged to be a criminal of the worst wort. but no one knows whether he is guilty or not. He has not yet been tried, but his commanding officer. Lt.-Col. J. A. Currie believes that he is innecent.

Cobb made a great mistake. He went to London on leave, discarded his uniform, wore a civilian's suit. which is in violation of the military regulations, and saw London, not as a coldier but as an ordinary tourist. He ran into some friends and wore a dress sult very becomingly at the Ho-tel Cecil. This of course aroused suspicion, and he was arrested by Scotland Yard men. It is said that strong aversion to the detectives. In fact he started a fight which ended in his favor and he made his escape. He later was arrested by a member of the regiment, who was detailed to
