

# MAY LET KOHLMAN FREE ON PAROLE

Decision Now Rests With Lieut.-  
Col. Elliott and Chief of  
Police

Some decision in the Kohlman case will probably be arrived at within the next twenty-four hours. This morning Kohlman, who is now the only German interned in Stanley barracks, was examined by Lt.-Col. Elliot A.G.G., in whose hands the matter has been placed by General Otter. Col. Elliot stated to The Daily News this morning that he had decided to refer the matter back to Lt.-Col. Grasett, chief of police, whose men originally arrested the ex-civic employe. If the chief of police is agreeable, it is probable that Kohlman will spend the New Year at semi-liberty; that is to say, he will be allowed out on parole that he will not leave the country, and he will have to report daily at headquarters for at least a month.
