

FIFTY-SEVEN DEATHS

Among the Canadian Contingent at Salisbury Plain

Ottawa, Jan. 19.—In three months to date there have been fifty-seven deaths among the Canadian troops at Salisbury, of these twenty-one died of spinal meningitis. A large number of cases of pneumonia proved fatal. There were several accidental deaths and two suicides. With the removal of the troops from their swampy quarters, it is expected that the death rate will decrease.
