30 Blind Pigs Raided Near Welland

Last night O. P. Inspecting Mains received instructions to go to Weiland with a staff of his constables to meet Inspector Avesarts, of the Licensed Depisitinest, Parliamentary Buildines, Toronto. Mains took with him Officers, Greenwood, Pay, Kelly, and Wadsworth, This body of the Niagara men were met on arrival by Chief Liang, of Weiland, and Chief of Police Taylor, or Thrould, who also were accompanied by farces. The whole party of officers and men proceeded into the steel plant district, in the township of Humberstone, just over the boundary lined Weiland. There they raided various boarding houses and stores run as blind pigs, some by women. Thirty-five male and female prisoners were arrested, as d are today being charged before Police Magistrate Burgary at Weiland with certain infractions of the liquor licensing act.

A Weiland correspondent, writing last night, gives another account.

as follows:—The biggest onshaucht ever made on liquor selling in the Nagara Preinsula was sent of tonight by a squad of about 56 men under Chief Laine, consisting of members of the local force, the Provincial Constabulary, special officers and officials from the Liquor Department in Toronto. The raid covered thirty stores, dwelling houses and boarding houses in the foreign section of South Welland and Crowland. Over two dozen charges of the violation of the Liquor Act were laid before Magistrate Burgar tonight. Fines in this section of the town have been frequent and heavy in the past year, and the authorities are convinced that there has been no diminution of the illegal sale of liquor in the foreign section.
