ROSEDALE GERMAN MAKES HIS ESCAPE

Police Arrest and Intern Lieu-

tenant Whom They Say He Was Assisting.

Despite the efforts of the Toronto police, a Toronto wholesaler-a German and a resident of Rosedale for

the past 15 years-made his escape from Canada. The police say he furnished funds and endeavored to aid a German lieutenant to leave for the

United States. How near the lieutenant came to getting away may be judged from the fact that he was taken from a train at the Union Station as he was about to leave the

city. He was taken before the Registrar of Aliens, and is now interned

at Stanley Barracks. "The man who gave him the money and was assisting him to leave the

country must have obtained some inkling that we wanted him, for he got away almost immediately," said Inspector of Detectives Kennedy to-

day. The inspector refused to give

the name or the man who made his escape, but said he was one of the largest wholesale men in Toronto. Col. Grasett. interviewed by The Star admitted that the information was correct. correct. "When we searched the lieutenant's

when we searched the lieutenant's trunks we found papers that proved that he was a reservist and that he had been appointed a lieutenant a short time before the war broke out. He had many communications from German oficers and was then preparing to leave for the United States on his way to Germany."

"He has gone, and I don't suppose he will be seen about Toronto for

he will be seen about Toronto for some time—at least not until the war is over," said the chief of police. "It is just a question whether we can reach him or not after the war is over."
