## Asks Information as to Number of Soldiers on Duty

### GUARD FOR ALIENS

## Twenty Men to go With Body to Northern Camp

His honor, the Lieutenant-Governor, Col. J. B. Hendrie, was a prominent visitor at the Exhibition Military Camp yesterday and inspected the Mounted Rifles Regiment. Another inspector was also made by the Board of Examining Officers from Ottawa of the mounted corps in the camp.

H.R.H. Princess Mary has requested information as to the total number of men in the local division. The total was found to be 5,912, which includes all the men at camp and those on guard at various stations including the Welland Canal. It is said that Princess Mary is planning to give a souvenir to every soldier on duty in Canada similar to the presents of tobacco and chocolate to the men at Salisbury Plain.

The twenty-fifth case of pneumonia was reported yesterday, but the general health of the camp continues very fine. No serious ailments have been contracted and no deaths have occurred since the camp was established. About 1,200 men were vaccinated yesterday and another thousand are to receive the vaccine to-day.

### Route Marching.

Route marching on the streets in Parkdale was indulged in yesterday by many of the small units and in many cases the men marched considerable distances without their great coats, although the mercury was flirting with the zero mark.

The horses of the Mounted Rifle are becoming accustomed to the novelty of drill formations, while the men are rapidly becoming proficient riders. The preliminary training of the men includes bareback riding so that they can learn control without the use of the saddle or stirrups.

A guard of twenty men from the Royal Grenadiers has been detailed to guard a body of alien enemies during their transfer from the local detention camp to Northern Ontario. They will probably leave on Sunday.

The overseas contingent of the 103rd Regiment is over strength. An announcement to this effect was made at a concert at the armoury of this regiment, 109 Wellington street west, last night.
