

CANADIAN PACIFIC BRIDGE BLOWN UP; GERMAN ARRESTED

**Span of Railway Bridge Across
St. Croix River Destroyed by
Dynamite Today.**

TRAFFIC UNINTERRUPTED

**Suspect Arrested Claims To Be
German Officer and Has Ad-
mitted the Deed.**

Vanceboro, Maine, Feb. 2.—One span of the Canadian Pacific railroad bridge across the St. Croix river between Vanceboro and St. Croix, N.B., was blown up early today. A preliminary investigation indicated that the explosion was caused by dynamite. The portion destroyed was on the New Brunswick side of the river. Until the repairs are made passengers will be transferred across the ice.

Traffic Resumed

Montreal, Feb. 2.—The Canadian Pacific Railway Company, in an official statement regarding the blowing up of the Vanceboro bridge over the St. Croix river, reports traffic uninterrupted and repairs immediately commenced. A suspicious character arrested by United States officials admitted the deed and said that he was a German officer.
