

HORN WAS RESERVIST

Boston Lawyer Claims To Be in Possession of New Evidence

NEW YORK, Feb. 11.—Daniel T. O'Connell, a lawyer of Boston, who has been retained in the defense of Werner Horn in the pending extradition proceedings for his transfer to Canada to face a charge of attempting to blow up a railway bridge between Maine and New Brunswick, visited the Hotel Arietta in Tompkinsville, S.C., today and took possession of Horn's trunk, which had been left there. Before leaving this city for Boston, Mr. O'Connell said that papers in the trunk prove that Horn is a reserve officer in the German army and on this he will base his defense of his act, claiming it to be a political crime and not extraditable.
