NO MONEY FOR ALIEN ENEMY Interesting Judgment on War Issue Given at Osgoode.

Mr. Justice Sutherland refused to

grant a motion at Osgoode Hall to compel Maurice Teller to pay over the sum of \$5,500 to E. J. Myers, and Rudolph Saenger of the Novelty Import Company. Saenger was born in Germany, but had a residence in Lyons, France, from 1893 to July, 1914. "The plaintiff is apparently an alien enemy," says the Judge. "It is not

at all clear that his residence here is for any other than a temporary purpose, and to enable him to realize upon his assets and take the money

out of the Province. I do not think it would be expedient or proper for me at this time to make the order asked. "If the plaintiffs are in any way ap-

prehensive about the safety of their money, an order may be made to pay

it into Court pending the final disposition of the action. The motion is therefore refused."
