

STOLE INTO COUNTRY AT WINDSOR FERRY

Three Men Were Refused Ad- mission by Immigration Officials

NOT ALLOWED BAIL

All Were Remanded Till Mon- day For Further Inquiry

Wm. Kerr, Aloys Knetzke, and Walter Rosuellet answered to the serious charge of breach of the immigration law by entering the country without fulfilling the proper requirements.

R. G. Long and Co., glove makers, secured the three men in Milwaukee to bring them to Toronto. Two of them are German-Americans and the other a Swiss.

When they reached Sarnia they were refused admission and wired to the company of their trouble. An employe of the company was sent to them and their baggage was expressed to the city and the men sneaked across on the ferry at Windsor.

The men were remanded till Monday without bail and it is probable that informatio may be sworn out against the company. The prosecution of the case is in charge of traveling immigration inspectors D. H. Reynolds and Percy Reid, under instructions from Ottawa.
