

U.S. FEDERAL OFFICERS ARREST WERNER HORN

**GERMAN WHO TRIED TO WRECK
C.P.R. BRIDGE JUST COMPLETES
ONE JAIL TERM.**

(Canadian Press Despatch.)

Machias, Maine, March 7.—Werner Horn, the German **reservist** who attempted to blow up the international bridge at Vanceboro early last month, and asserted that he did so as "an act of war" against Great Britain, became a Federal prisoner to-night. He will be taken to Bangor to-morrow for arraignment on indictments charging illegal transportation of explosives from New York to Vanceboro, returned by a Federal Grand Jury in Boston.

Horn has just finished a sentence of thirty days in the Washington county jail here owing to property damage caused in Vanceboro by the explosion at the Canadian end of the bridge.

Proceedings for the extradition of Horn to Canada on the charge of attempting to blow up the bridge, which were instituted at Portland in behalf of the Canadian Government, will be delayed until the Federal indictment has been disposed of.

DIVED FROM WINDOW, HURT, BUT RAN AWAY

**DESPERATE ACT OF SOLDIER ON
HIS THIRD DESERTION FROM
ST. JOHN'S.**

Montreal, March 7.—Private John Munsey, who had deserted twice from the St. John's, Que., military post, and was on his third desertion, being about to be re-taken yesterday by detectives, dived from his bedroom window at his boarding-house, corner of Atwater avenue and Notre Dame street, Montreal, to the street, about thirty feet. Several ribs were fractured, one wrist was sprained and his back was hurt, yet he picked himself up and ran away. When overtaken by the detectives he showed fight, but was arrested and taken to a hospital.

OTTAWA MAN ARRESTED.

**Fraser Charged With Violating U. S.
Immigration Law.**

Detroit, March 7.—Because, it is charged, he entered the United States unlawfully and attempted to bring a woman into this country under the same conditions, Robert W. Fraser, who says he is from Ottawa, was arrested by U. S. immigration inspectors Saturday and placed in jail. A young woman from Toronto joined him on Saturday morning.

A charge of being unlawfully in the United States and bringing a woman unlawfully was placed against Fraser, and he was taken to the county jail. The young woman will be deported.

PEDDLER RUN DOWN.

**Arthur Bradley Suffers Internal In-
juries.**

As he stepped from behind a coal waggon on Wilton avenue on Saturday afternoon, Arthur Bradley, aged thirty-five, a peddler living at 139 Garden road, Todmorden, was knocked down by an automobile driven by Samuel Graham, 1,068 Yonge street, and owned by Mr. A. R. Clarke, 613 Eastern avenue. Bradley has internal injuries and a fractured leg. He was removed to the General Hospital by the police ambulance. The driver of the automobile was not detained by the police.
