

THE DOMINION.

Parliament has decided that soldiers should vote, but the method is not yet determined.

Mayor Mederic Martin of Montreal, for motoring in Mount Royal Park, was mulcted \$10 and costs.

Interned alien enemies in ten detention camps number 2,294, have cost \$112,590 and have done work worth \$15,000.

Wm. Stitt, General Passenger Agent of C. P. R. eastern lines, died suddenly in one of the company's offices at Montreal, aged 60 years.

A. E. Phelan, an artist, 82 years old, without friends or relatives in the city, was found dead from starvation in his flat on Laval avenue, Montreal.

A Royal Commission will be appointed to investigate Liberal charges that more than \$800,000 was wrongfully spent in connection with the erection of the Manitoba Parliament buildings.

Col. McBain testified before the Public Accounts Committee that the army horses found with farmers near Valcartier had been left with them to keep till fit to be returned to the Remount Department, and receipts had been secured for them, and that some strayed horses had been recovered.

TORONTO.
