

# ASKS EMPLOYERS TO BAR ALIEN ENEMIES

Only Those Who Have Registration Cards Should be Engaged, Says Capt. Davidson

Employers of labor have been notified by Captain Davidson, registrar of alien enemies, 113 Colony street, that it is in the public interest as well as in the interest of the labor community that they should not engage any alien of enemy nationality who has failed to register at the above office.

All employers are requested to show their patriotism by insisting upon the production of naturalization papers or registration cards before engaging men of enemy nationality in any capacity, whether for work in Winnipeg or at outside points.

The various railway companies have been carrying out this policy for some time, as they contend that it is only fair that those aliens of enemy nationality who have complied with the law by registering should have the first chance of employment.

Commissioner Reynolds, of the Greater Winnipeg Water District, has willingly complied with the request, as he is naturally desirous that the important work of construction should not be delayed through the rounding up by the authorities of any delinquents at the various employment camps. All the contractors on this great work have been notified and all other employers of labor, whether in factory, warehouse, store, hotel or restaurant, if they wish to avoid any dislocation of their business through the compulsory withdrawal of any members of their staff should make it their duty to see that all their employees of enemy nationality are duly registered.
