Coleridge, R.N.W.M.P., he admitted serving (we sentences of nine months and six months for false pretences, and futther admitted that on the day of his release from gaol he presented a ther admitted that on the day of his release from guel he presented a cheque for small purchases for \$20.00 at the Elite Cigar store, and at the Lethbridge Saddlery store, and expected to get the change, although he admitted he had no banking account either in Lethbridge or elsewhere.

In sentencing him, the magistrate told him that the fact that he was a flerman did not influence him; but he was reminded that he deliberately

he was reminded that he deliberately walked out of gad and proved himself a vagrant by attempting to repeat the offences that he had served time for, and although the C.P.R. officials were confrients to him, in advising him to apply for advice to the proper anthorities, his reply was a torrent of abuse and obscene language in a public place. The sentence would be six months hard labor in the guard six months hard labor in the guard room at the H.N.W.M.P. barracks at Lethbridge.
