There will be no more naturalization papers granted to alien enemies till after the war, according to the decision of Registrar of Alien Enemies. "The reason," said Mr. A. J. Rus-

sell Snow, K. C., in refusing the application of a German who had been in this country eight years, coming here from England, "is that I have information that naturalization papers are being used by former aliens who want to get across the border into the United States. They speak of this country in worse terms after they have got their papers than they did before."
