FOUR GERMANS ARRESTED

Celebrated in Vancouver Victory Over Canadian Troops

Vancourer, April 29 .- Four prominent German residents of Vancouver were arrested today because the police believe Sunday night the quartette, with a number of other compatriots, engaged in a celebration of the German advance against Canadian troops at Ypres. It happened that the first and a very heavy casualty list of Vancouver men killed and wounded reached Vancouver Sunday night and it was an unlucky time for the Germans to celebrate anything. The Germans concerned declare they were merely having a house warming. the party having been arranged several days previously. It is probable the four will be sent to a detention camp for alien enemies at Nanaimo. The men now detained are Paul Koopf, a capitalist, Baron von Luttowitz, a relative and intimate friend of the Kaiser, Dr. Otto Grunert and Frederick Stritzel.
