ALIENS REQUEST TO BE

INTERNED IN BRANDON

Winnipeg, Man., May 19 .- Daily the contribution from Winnipeg's alien enemy area to the Brandon detention camp grow in number. Usually the individual facing internment finds small comfort in the situation, but apparently there are some who appreciate the advantage of getting three "squares" a day even at the expense of their liberty, for in one day eight Austrians presented themselves at the Colony street registration office, and requested to be sent to Brandon. Two more aliens were forwarded to the camp yesterday morning, one, a German, for breaking his parole by at-

tempting to board a train for the

States. Only a small number at pre-

sent attempt to leave the country sur-

reptitiously, the majority trying by

various pretexts to get the necessary

passports to facilitate their journey.

Many claim to be Alsacians and not

responsible for their Teutonic accent

and habits. One such requested per-

mission to leave the country a few

days ago, but as he bore a German

name and was unable to speak French

he narrowly escaped being locked up.
