

GERMAN RESERVIST IS UNDER ARREST

**Made Affidavit That the Lusitania
Was Armed — Further
Investigation.**

New York, June 11.—The Federal grand jury which yesterday began an investigation to determine whether there was an attempt to defraud the United States in connection with the affidavits submitted to prove that the steamer Lusitania was armed with guns was temporarily adjourned. The investigation thus far has resulted in the arrest on a charge of perjury, of Gustav Stahl, a German reservist, who made one of Lusitania affidavits but it was said today the results would be much more far-reaching than at first thought. The charge directed against Paul Koenig employed by the Hamburg-American steamship line, and through whose hands Stahl's affidavit is alleged to have passed, by the government authorities indicated today that they were seeking to find out who Koenig was acting for.

The name of today's grand jury witnesses was kept a secret, but his testimony was said to be important. Stahl, who was taken into custody yesterday immediately on the conclusion of his testimony before the jury, was still in the Tombs today for lack of a bondsman to furnish \$10,000 bail.
