

PRISONER KILLED FOLLOWING ATTACK ON CAMP GUARD

**Four Other Germans at Amherst
Camp Shot in Attempt to
Make Getaway**

ASSAULTED GUARD

**Five Hundred Men in Camp, In-
cluding German Sailors Cap-
tured in the Atlantic**

Amherst, N.S., June 25—During an outbreak last night at the alien enemy internment camp near Amherst, one of the prisoners, Fritz Clause, a German, was shot dead, and four others, also said to be Germans, were seriously wounded. A rumor was abroad during the day that the shooting occurred when a squad of German prisoners attempted to escape. Few details are obtainable.

The official story follows:

“While the prisoners of war were being conducted to the compound for physical exercise, one of them, Fritz Clause by name, assaulted one of the internment camp police, knocking him insensible. The guard was called out to quell the mutiny and in the melee which followed the original instigator was shot dead and four other prisoners more or less seriously wounded.”

There are about 500 prisoners in the camp, including more than 100 German sailors who were rescued after engagements in the Atlantic.
