

UPHOLSTERER FROM WELLAND INTERNEDED

Edward Albert, a Welland upholsterer, was arrested by the military authorities Tuesday night, on the ground that he was of pro-German sympathy and therefore a danger to the country. It is alleged that he was of strong pro-German tendency, and his movements have been under surveillance for some time past. He was taken in custody by an officer of the militia department just as he was alighting from a Buffalo train. He was brought to Niagara Falls and will from here be taken to one of the detention camps.

When searched he was found to have a large number of newspaper clippings from American papers relating to munitions of war, to guns and the relative power of the guns of the different nations. A long strip of artificial leather was also found on his person which had evidently been taken over from Buffalo, evading the customs authorities.
