

German, Interned In N.S., Hits Guard, Is Shot and Killed

AMHERST, N.S. — In quelling a mutiny at the alien internment camp at Amherst yesterday, Fritz Claus, a German, who had struck one of the camp police knocking him insensible, was shot dead, and four others, also said to be Germans, were seriously wounded.

The mutiny occurred while the prisoners were being conducted to the compound for physical exercise. The camp police and the guard were called to quell the mutiny. There are about 500 prisoners in the camp, including more than 100 German sailors, who were rescued after engagements in the Atlantic.
