Bill is Introduced

Intention Not to Coerce Labor But to Ascertain Nation's Resources

London, June 29.—Walter Hume Long, President of the Local Government Board, to-day introduced in the House of Commons a bill for the compilation of a national register, the object of which, he remarked, was not to coerce labor, but to secure complete information regarding the resources of the country and to enable them to be satisfactorily organized.

The measure seeks to classify all persons below the age of 65, and to ascertain the present occupation and direction wherein service can be rendered by each.
