These agents are also actuated by the further motive of acquiring, when the workmen have become their dupes, information as to war work which would be of value to the enemy. Plentifully supplied with money, these originators of strikes are very liberal in the gifts they make to workmen, and there is distinct evi-

dence that the strikes which have broken out since the war began have

been formented in a great measure by German sples.
