

CZAR'S RESERVISTS MAY ENLIST WITH CANADIAN UNITS

**Special Decree Issued by His
Imperial Majesty June
18 Last**

SEWELL, July 20.—It is notified that by a special decree of His Imperial Majesty, the Czar of Russia, issued on June 18, 1915, permission is given to Russian subjects, reservists and territorials, privates and non-commissioned officers only to enlist with the Canadian overseas contingent.

Recruiting officers are being instructed to make sure in every case of the identity of any Russian subject proposing to enlist, by communicating with the imperial Russian consulate at Montreal, requesting that a certificate be furnished.

Four new overseas battalions and one detachment of 5,000 men have been authorized to be mobilized in military district No. 10 through contingent orders by Col. H. N. Ruttan, D.O.C.

This additional 5,000 men will form part of the fourth contingent.

The 65th overseas battalion will have temporary headquarters at Saskatoon and Prince Albert. Lieut.-Col. Norman Lang of the 29th Light Horse has been appointed as commanding officer.

The 68th battalion will have temporary headquarters at Regina and Moose Jaw.

Major T. E. Perrett of the 95th Saskatchewan Rifles has been appointed as second in command of the battalion.
