

GERMANS ARE QUITE SAFE.

Uncle Sam Will Protect Them From Wrath of Kaiser.

Washington, July 24.—State Department officials said to-day that Germans in the United States, who might be prosecuted, as was announced from Berlin for working in ammunition factories in lands supplying war material to Germany's enemies were in no danger of extradition and would not come under the effect of the German law while they remain in the United States.

Should such Germans become naturalized Americans in the meantime and return to Germany at the close of the war they are protected by the naturalization treaty under which the United States could intervene in their behalf.
