THREE WINDSOR MEN COMMITTED FOR TRIAL

CHARGED WITH ASSISTING ALIEN ENEMIES TO LEAVE CANADA.

(Special Despatch to The Globe.)

Windsor, July 27.—Sufficient evidence was produced by Canadian immigration officials in Police Magistrate Leggatt's court here this afternoon to warrant him in committing for trial Max Laker, Victor Caron and William Lonnee of Windsor, arrested carly last week on charges of having assisted allen enemies of Great Britain to escape from Canada.

Nicholas Knosky and Michael Sisisky, Itussians, testified that they came to Windsor from Cobalt three weeks ago in company with two Austrans. They were told, they said, that Laker was the man to see here, that he could get them into the United States without trouble. They swore they paid Laker \$9 each, for which price they were conveyed to Detroit, going by way of street car from Windsor to Amhersthurg, and there boarding an excursion steamer which landed them on American soil.

The Austrians are held at the Armories here, while the Russians will be detained as witnesses until the case is called for trial. It is believed the Windsor men will be charged with treason.
