Montreal, July 28.—A man who gave his name as Jean Bouchard, and his home as Luxembourg, was arrested yesterday on Mount Royal. Amongst papers found in Bouchard's pockets was a small map of the city, on which the location of the different armories, the railway stations, public buildings, pumping stations, and reservoirs, as
